We have audited, in accordance with *Government Auditing Standards* issued by the Comptroller General of the United States, the basic financial statements of the City of Brooklyn, Cuyahoga County, Ohio (the City), for the year ended December 31, 2019, and have separately issued our unmodified report thereon dated June 5, 2020. These statements present the Landfill within the City's governmental activities.

In a letter to the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency dated June 5, 2020 (the Letter), Tom Raguz, Director of Finance of the City of Brooklyn, Ohio's Sanitary Landfill, specified that certain amounts disclosed in that Letter were derived from the independently audited financial statements referred to in the first paragraph above.

We have performed the procedures described below as agreed to by the City of Brooklyn, Ohio, and by the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency, solely to assist you in determining that certain amounts reported in the letter agreed to, or can be computed from, amounts presented in the audited basic financial statements. We followed the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants' attestation standards for agreed-upon procedures engagements and applicable attestation engagement standards included in *Government Auditing Standards*, issued by the Comptroller General of the United States. Consequently, we make no representation regarding the sufficiency of the procedures described below either for the purpose for which this report has been requested or for any other purpose.
