



Audits

- The Special Investigations Unit (SIU) brings together the disciplines of forensic accounting and fraud investigation, along with attorneys who have expertise in fraud and white-collar criminal prosecution to investigate government fraud.
 - How they investigate
 - Report fraud
- Findings for Recovery – issued by the Auditor of State when public funds have been misspent or property has been misappropriated
 - General search if you are not required by law to show certification
 - Certified search, as required by [ORC § 9.24](#), to verify that the person to whom you plan to award a contract does not appear in the database

Local Governments

- Financial Health Indicators (FHI) are a proactive approach to monitoring or assisting cities, counties, and school districts that show early signs of fiscal stress.
 - A “fiscal physical” to identify signs of heightened fiscal stress
 - Indicators are a collection of financial information, percentages, and ratios gathered from annual financial statements
 - Heat Map – grid of FHI at a glance for each entity, provided as a summary and analysis
 - Report search
 - Trend search
 - Descriptions of the Indicators
 - User Guides

Local Governments



- Hinkle System Financial Reporting
 - The Auditor of State is responsible for ensuring that local public offices file their annual financial reports as required by the Ohio Revised Code (ORC) and Ohio Administrative Code (OAC).
 - The Hinkle System is an application developed by the Auditor of State's office to facilitate filing of certain financial statements, debt, and demographic data to the AOS, satisfying the filing requirements of the ORC and OAC.
 - All entities required to file annually with the AOS must file via the Hinkle System through logging into your entity's eServices account. There is also a "Share Link" option to provide access to a preparer.
 - For most UAN clients, the entity's required filing via the Hinkle System will be part of their year-end UAN processing.
 - Some small government entities may be unable to file electronically, you can find this waiver here
 - The AOS will consider granting an extension when the circumstances listed in AOS [Bulletin 2015-007](#) exist or have occurred. The request for extension should be submitted to the AOS via the Hinkle System no later than the deadline for filing the annual financial report.

Local Governments



- Fiscal Distress

- Fiscal distress is a legislative tool used to identify financial problems early and provide support to entities in need.
- 3 Levels of Fiscal Distress in Ohio
 1. Fiscal Caution - early warning signs of financial trouble & the entity needs to fix the problems before they get worse
 2. Fiscal Watch - financial problems are more serious & the state requires a financial plan & watches closely to see if the entity can recover on its own.
 3. Fiscal Emergency - the entity is in deep financial trouble & can't fix it alone. The AOS will form a financial and supervision commission to provide oversight to ensure that the entity prepares a financial recovery plan and that appropriations & spending are consistent with the plan.

Open Government

Open Government Unit

- Ohio's Sunshine Laws give all citizens the right to broad access to government records and meetings. To support this right, the Auditor of State (AOS) offers public records training and processes public records requests.
- Ohio Sunshine Laws
 - The Ohio Attorney General's Office publishes the Ohio Sunshine Laws annually.
 - It is an Open Government resource manual, providing extensive information on the Ohio Public Records Act and Ohio Open Meetings Act.

 1. Special Investigations Unit (SIU) - promotes transparency and accountability in the use of public funds, to expose fraud and corruption where it exists, and to assist law enforcement and prosecutors in the pursuit of justice

- Public Affairs
 1. Public Affairs – serves as a liaison between the Auditor of State's office and the news media
 2. Regional Liaisons – responsible for field operations in each of the Auditor of State's nine local offices: Akron, Athens, Cincinnati, Cleveland, Columbus, Dayton, Toledo, Youngstown, and the Ohio region. The liaisons serve as a link among the Auditor of State's office and the public, local officials, and constituents.
